AN ACT to amend section 60-415, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, as amended by Laws 1970, Chapter 1, section 1, relating to motor vehicles; to provide that a person may receive more than one duplicate operators license or permit in the event of loss for fifty cents; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 60-415, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, as amended by Laws 1970, Chapter 1, section 1, be amended to read as follows:

60-415. (1) In the event of the loss of a license or permit by any person duly licensed under the provisions of this act, such person may obtain one a duplicate upon filing with the county treasurer an application and affidavit showing such loss. Upon the officer being satisfied that the loss is genuine, he shall issue, upon the payment of a fee of fifty cents, a duplicate license or permit. Such fee shall be handled by the treasurers in the same manner as original or renewal license fees; Provided, such duplicate license or permit fee in each instance shall be credited, allocated, and accounted for by the county treasurer as in the cases of original and renewal motor vehicle operators license fees as provided in section 60-409.

(2) If any person changes his or her name because of marriage or divorce or other court order, he shall apply to the county treasurer for a replacement motor vehicle operator's license, and furnish satisfactory evidence of such change, and such license shall be issued without charge. Such application shall be made within thirty days after the change of name. If any person changes his or her address, he may apply to the county treasurer for a replacement motor vehicle operator's license, and furnish satisfactory evidence of such change, and such license shall be issued without charge.

Sec. 2. That original section 60-415, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, as amended by Laws 1970, Chapter 1, section 1, is repealed.
