

## LEGISLATIVE BILL 481

Approved by the Governor January 31, 1972

AN ACT relating to insurance; to require prescribed notice of cancellation of a policy of automobile liability insurance; to provide exceptions; to provide the effect of noncompliance; and to declare an emergency.  
Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. A notice of cancellation, given for reasons other than for nonpayment of premium, of a policy of automobile liability insurance issued or delivered in this state, shall only be effective if mailed by registered or certified mail to the named insured at the address shown in the policy at least thirty days prior to the effective date of such cancellation.

This section shall not apply to any policy issued under an automobile assigned risk plan or to any policy of insurance issued principally to cover personal or premises liability of an insured even though such insurance may also provide some incidental coverage for liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle on the premises of the insured or on the ways adjoining such premises. Any attempted cancellation in violation of the provisions of this section shall be void.

Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act shall be in full force and take effect, from and after its passage and approval, according to law.
