AN ACT to amend section 24-708, Revised Statutes
Supplement, 1972, relating to the retirement
system for judges; to make retirement
mandatory at age seventy-two except as
prescribed; and to repeal the original
section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 24-708, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1972, be amended to read as follows:

24-708. Any judge may retire upon reaching the age of sixty-five and upon making application to the board. Any judge upon reaching age seventy seventy\_two shall retire; Provided, that any judge\_holding\_office\_on the effective date of this act may complete the term\_for which he was elected. Upon retiring each such judge shall receive retirement annuities as provided in section 24-710. When-any-incumbent-judge-mattains-the-age-of seventy,-said-judge-may-if-he-so-desires-finish-serving the-term-during-which-he-attains-the-age-of-seventy.

Sec. 2. That original section 24-708, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1972, is repealed.
