AN ACT to amend section 24-201.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, relating to courts; to increase judges' salaries as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 24-201.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, be amended to read as follows:

paid under the Constitution of Nebraskay the Chief dustice and sudges of the Supreme Court shall each receive an annual swiary of forty-three thousand dollars. On January 8, 1981, the salary of the Chief Justice and Judges of the Supreme Court shall be increased to an amount equal to six per cent forty-eight thousand three hundred fourteen dollars and eighty cents. As soon as the same may be legally paid under the Constitution of Tebraska, the salary shall be increased to an amount equal to five per cent over the base salary. For the purposes of this section, base salary shall mean the amount derived by increasing forty-three thousand dollars by six forty-eight thousand three hundred fourteen dollars and eighty cents by five per cent. On January 5, 1984, the salary shall be increased by five per cent of the salary received immediately prior to such date. On January 1, 1985, the salary shall be increased by five per cent of the salary received immediately prior to such date. On January 1, 1986, the salary shall be increased by five per cent of the salary thousand dollars. The Chief Justice and the Judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the government of the United States for which they receive compensation for their services. Such salaries

shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
