## LEGISLATIVE BILL 44

Approved by the Governor April 5, 1991

Introduced by Baack, 47

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend sections 60-462, 60-4,112, and 60-4,123, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1990; to change provisions authorizing certain persons to drive on the highways as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 60-462, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1990, be amended to read as follows:

60-462. Sections 60-462 to 60-4,181 and section 4 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act.

Sec. 2. That section 60-4,112, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1990, be amended to read as follows:

60-4,112. Sections 60-4,114 to 60-4,130 and section 4 of this act shall apply to the operation of any motor vehicle except a commercial motor vehicle.

Sec. 3. That section 60-4,123, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1990, be amended to read as follows:

60-4,123. Any person who is at least fifteen years of age may obtain an LPD-learner's permit from the county treasurer, which permit shall be valid for a period of twelve months, and he or she may operate a motor vehicle on the highways of this state if he or she is accompanied at all times by a licensed operator who is at least nineteen years of age and who is actually occupying the seat beside the driver or, in the case of a motorcycle or moped, if he or she is within visual contact of and under the supervision of, in the case of a motorcycle, a licensed motorcycle operator or, in the case of a motorcycle, a licensed motorcycle operator. Any person who has attained the age of fearteen years may eperate a meter vehicle upon the highways of this state if he or she is accompanied or, in the case of a metercycle or moped, supervised at all times by a licensed operator who is a high school driver training instructor certified by the Commissioner of Education.

The county treasurer shall collect a fee of three dollars from each successful applicant for an LPD-learner's permit.

Sec. 4. Any person who has attained or will attain the age of fourteen years on or before October 15 of the current year may operate a motor vehicle upon the highways of this state if he or she is accompanied or, in the case of a motorcycle or moped, supervised at all times by a licensed operator who is a driver training instructor certified by the Commissioner of Education.

Sec. 5. That original sections 60-462, 60-4,112, and 60-4,123, Revised Statutes Supplement,

1990, are repealed.
